

## STEP BACK IN TIME...

During World War II, the great-grandson of John Deere, Charles Deere Wiman, was president of the company, but he accepted a commission as a colonel in the U.S. Army. A replacement was hired and before returning to work at the company in late 1944, Wiman directed the farm machinery and equipment division of the War Production Board. In addition to farm machinery, John Deere manufactured military tractors, and transmissions for the M3 tank. They also made aircraft parts, ammunition, and mobile laundry units to support the war effort.

John Deere is launching two new top of the range six-cylinder tractor models rated at 171 kW (230 hp) and 186 kW (250 hp) (97/68 EC).

The 6230R and 6250R are both powered by a 6.8 L PowerTech™ PSS engine with dual turbochargers and advanced DPF and SCR technology, which responds very quickly to changing loads while consuming less fuel. The high maximum permissible weight of 15 tonnes allows a 5.7 tonne payload. The upgraded AutoPowr™ transmission delivers maximum efficiency, with 100 per cent mechanical power available at 3.5 km/h for heavy draft operations, 11 km/h for light draft work, 22.5 km/h for heavy transport and 47.2 km/h for light transport duties. Once running at maximum road speed, RPM automatically drops which results in lower fuel consumption on the road.

Key service points are easy to access for maintenance and both models feature 750 hour engine oil filter, fuel filter and engine oil intervals, helping to further reduce parts and servicing costs. Ask us for more information.

## Modifications & Engine Control remapping John Deere products

We would like to respectfully remind owners that unapproved modifications or remapping is clearly outside the John Deere guidelines, and may result in major mechanical or structural failures on the machine.

In these situations, these failures may NOT be covered by warranty as the warranty agreement is made void by such modifications. Such changes may well create safety hazards endangering operators and those working around the machine. Product liability penalties can be severe, and can lead to potential litigation in the event of injury to employees or technicians working on the machine.

Things to remember:

- Any modification may result in warranty, including extended warranty being disallowed
- Any modification to a machine or implement can shift duty of care from the manufacturer to the modifier (owner).

As John Deere dealers we are also obligated to advise that if technical work is carried out by staff who are required to reset the machines operating systems to factory defaults, that we accept no responsibility for aftermarket modifications performance including engine control remapping or chips, in warranty and out of warranty. We have seen instances where the modification has had unintended consequences, and the machine has had to be reset to standard at considerable expense. It is also essential for our technical staff to know of such modifications to allow proper diagnosis of problems encountered.

The intent of this notice is to alert owners of some of the implications of such modifications and to remind owners and operators of our dealer obligations and your obligations as an owner, Thank you for your continued business.
